FLORIDA HEALTHY BABIES HERNANDO: TARGETS AND ACTION STEPS

Targets:

June 2018: Maintain2013-15 Infant Mortality Rate at or below 7.0 deaths per 1,000 live births
June 2021: Decrease in Infant Mortality Rate to at or below 6.1 deaths per 1,000 live births (Florida 213-15 rate is 6.1).

Action Steps:

1) By December 31, 2016, the Hernando Florida Healthy Baby (FHB) Community Group members will help to strengthen the Hernando County Breastfeeding Task Force by attending 50% of the meetings and participating in its action plans.

Indicator

FHB Community Group member(s) regularly attend meetings and participate in its action plans.

2) By TBD, at least one Hernando County Hospital will be a Baby-Friendly hospital.

Indicator

FHB Community Group supports and assists activities towards this certification.

3) By December 31, 2016, the Hernando FHB members will help to strengthen the Hernando County Substance Exposed Newborn Task Force by attending 50% of the meetings and participating in its action plans.

Indicator

FHB Community Group member(s) regularly attend meetings and participate in its action plans.

4) By January 31, 2017, the Hernando FHB Community Group will adopt an Evidence-Based Strategy to promote Safe Sleep behaviors within the community and by health care providers (OB/GYN, Pediatricians, Primary Care Providers) in Hernando County. The strategy will target hard-to-reach families and those families at increased risk for preventable infant mortality in Hernando County, including Blacks and Hispanics.

<u>Indicators</u>

- a) An Evidence-Based Strategy is adopted by the Hernando FHB Community Group by January 31, 2017.
- b) Evaluation criteria is developed by the Hernando FHB Community Group by April 30, 2017.
- c) The Evidence-Based Strategy is implemented by 2 Community Groups and Health Care Providers (OB/GYN, Pediatricians, Primary Care Providers) in Hernando County by September 30, 2017.
- d) Hard-to-reach families and those families at increased risk for preventable infant mortality, including those on parole and in jail, along with Blacks and Hispanics, receive Safe Sleep education (minimum of 2 sessions) by March 30, 2017.
- 5) By December 31, 2017, two Hernando County hospitals will agree to adopt a Baby Box Project.

Indicators

- a) A marketing campaign that includes logistics and funding is developed by May 30, 2017.
- b) Meetings with key decision-makers at each hospital are conducted by July 31, 2017.
- 6) By December 31, 2018, two Hernando County hospitals will implement a Baby Box Project.

Indicators

- a) Boxes are offered to all mothers at the time of birth.
- b) Educational activities are done before each Baby Box is issued (for example: video, face-to-face encounter, contract).
- c) Follow-up outreach is done with every family within 2 weeks of delivery.
- 7) By June 30, 2018, the FHB Community Group will promote the Edinburgh Postnatal Depression Scale screening tool and referral protocol to Pediatric, OB/GYN, and Primary Care Providers who encounter Post-Partum women.

Indicators

- a) A team is formed to plan and provide outreach to the health care community by November 30, 2016.
- b) Number of health care providers visited (year 1 50% of Pediatricians and OB/GYN's, along with 20% of Primary Care Providers; year 2 50% of Pediatricians and OB/GYN's, along with an additional 40% of Primary Care Providers; year 3 the remaining Primary Care Providers.)
- c) Number of health care providers adopting screening tool and referral protocol.
